The 14th Nottingham Eye Symposium organized by former Bower Fellow Harminder S. Dua, MD, PhD was recently held in Nottingham, England. The Symposium was endowed by Nicholas R. Galloway in memory of his father. The first Symposia was held in 1997 where Professor Desmond B. Archer of Queen's University, Belfast delivered the Norman Galloway Lecture concerning diabetic Retinopathy. This years lecture "East and West" was given by Professor David Wong of the University of Liverpool and Hong Kong who spoke on a variety of subjects including macular

translocation and he described research as it pertains to Hong Kong and mainland China. Larry A. Donoso, MD, PhD was made an Honorary Delegate of the symposium. The second to be given this honor, following Nicholas R. Galloway in 2006. The Larry A. Donoso Research Laboratory resides in the Queens Medical Center in Nottingham, England under the direction of Harminder S. Dua.
